JOB SUMMARY: The Youth Specialist provides services and support to youth ages 18 to 24 who are resident in our Transitional Living Program. The Youth Specialist provides a variety of supportive and case management services including mentoring, coaching, behavioral support, education, transportation and other services that address overall needs of residents.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- 1) Act as primary contact for approximately 12 residents for their full length stay at the Transitional Living Program;
- 2) Complete a comprehensive intake and assessment of new residents to help determine needs, interests and goals;
- 3) Work with residents, and their current and previous supports to develop individual case plans to help them meet initial and intermediate goals in the areas of education and employment, housing stability, permanent connections and well-being;
- 4) Connect residents to supportive services such as mental health, health, substance abuse, employment and education both at The Youth Center and with external service providers. Act as liaison for resident with those resources;
- 5) Work effectively and creatively with the other members of an interdisciplinary case management team to support the needs of residents; attend case conferencing meetings to coordinate services with outside service providers;
- 6) Mentor and coach each young person to strive for independence through the completion of educational, career, mental health, and healthcare goals;
- 7) Be available to the residents for any needs ranging from crisis resolution to daily life skills management to escorting residents to appointments;
- 8) Accurately document services and complete data entry into HMIS and the Youth Services database system and prepare monthly reports as required;
- 9) Facilitate groups and workshops;
- 10) Work a flexible schedule to be able to connect with youth when they are available. This may include evenings and weekends;
- 11) Attend in-service training as required;
- 12) Participate in staff meetings, planning meetings and other meetings as needed;

JOB QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE:

- 1) Experience working with the LGBTQ community and familiarity with issues of particular relevance to LGBTQ people.
- 2) A passion for the Center's work and its mission to make the world a better place for LGBTQ people;
- 3) Bachelor's degree or equivalent work experience and training;
- 4) 2-3 years' experience providing direct services to high risk youth including counseling and advocacy;
- 5) Sensitive to the needs of gay, lesbian, bi-sexual, and transgender youth and youth experiencing homelessness;
- 6) Excellent verbal and written communication skills, including organizational, detail and interpersonal skills;
- 7) Strong computer skills and knowledge including word processing, spreadsheets, and database operations;
- 8) Ability to work effectively with men and women of diverse races, ethnicities, ages, and sexual orientations in a multicultural environment;
- 9) Bi-lingual English/Spanish strongly preferred;
- 10) Valid California Driver's license and clean DMV record (ability to obtain insurance);
- 11) Demonstrated ability to work effectively with people of diverse races, ethnicities, nationalities, sexual orientations, gender identities, socio-economic backgrounds, religions, ages, English-speaking abilities, immigration statuses, and physical abilities in a multicultural environment.
